Phlebotomy Technician  
Certificate of Completion

Curriculum Code: 1010 (Effective Fall 2016 – Summer 2018)

This certificate curriculum is designed to prepare a person to function as a phlebotomy technician. It will provide the knowledge, skills, and externship experience that is necessary to safely and skillfully obtain a blood specimen from a patient. A phlebotomist may work in a variety of settings such as hospitals, outpatient labs, physicians' offices, or clinics; or may travel to different locations such as convalescent hospitals.
