Curriculum Code: 1638 (Effective Fall 2016 – Summer 2017)

The EMS Educator–Coordinator curriculum is intended for teacher candidates who have proven their commitment to the profession through self–initiated field experiences and academic performance. The State of Michigan Licensing and Regulation Division of the Department of Community Health requires this curriculum/certification that is specific to the preparation and education of EMS Instructor–Coordinator Candidates. The curriculum gives the EMS educator the ability to engage in learner–centered, outcome based practices articulated by the National Guidelines for Educating EMS Instructors. The curriculum provides the opportunity for building and developing teaching skills that will lead to higher levels of instructional and administrative expertise in accordance with applicable state and federal mandates. Students who successfully complete this program are eligible to sit for the State of Michigan for EMS Instructor–Coordinator licensure exam.

NOTES:

1. Students must complete the courses above with a minimum grade of 3.0 to receive this certificate.

2. Students must have documentation of three years full-time experience with a Life Support Responding Agency, two letters of recommendation, and a valid EMS provider license at any level to receive Department Approval to enroll in these courses. An Instructor-Coordinator license is granted at the level of the provider license. Instructor-Coordinator license holders may not be licensed to teach at a license level that exceeds their own provider level. Instructor-Coordinator licenses are valid for a three year period and must be renewed with evidence of thirty hours of instructor continuing education in the month that the provider license renews.
