## About the associate degree program

This is a 61-credit program that can be completed in a minimum of four semesters. It qualifies individuals to be lead teachers in early education programs. Classes are offered at convenient times online, in-person and hybrid.

## How to fund your education

Currently, students over the age of 25 can attend LCC for free\* or reduced tuition through the Michigan Reconnect program. There are also federal grants and programs active to assist students with housing and food costs while attending classes.

Complete your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at **fafsa.gov** and visit **lcc.edu/reconnect** to determine if you are eligible for the MI Reconnect program.
