This report shows the success of transferring students by using IPEDS reporting on Graduation and Transfer rates. This data is reported three years after a student starts at LCC and hasn't been enrolled at any other college (e.g., a student beginning at LCC as a first-time college student in 2016 is reported in 2019 if they graduated or transferred from LCC in that timeframe). Subsequently, we provide these students with an additional three years after transferring to complete their degrees at the new institution, monitoring their graduation status at a total of six years from beginning college.
