VII. Provost's Report

- a. Last Spring semester caused a lot of interruptions. Last week A&S chiller failed. Worked on a plan A and plan B to get the building cooled down. Faculty and staff moved around well. Have emergency language in your syllabus. Make sure
- b. Trending positive on enrollment from year before. Continuing students continue to decrease. Retention and enrollment are everyone's job. WE have to do everything we can to support our students. Help students during life changes, engage with our students. Reach out to students, check in with students. Don't lower grading expectations, keep expectations the same. Paying attention to our students.
- c. Culture of Care teams kicking off their work. Appreciative education team and culture of care team will be meeting soon. Had a small pause for summer break.
- d. HLC is coming. Sept 23-24, 2024. Assurance argument due in August. Preparing to make sure they have everything they need. We have a lot of work to do. Kick this off at Board meeting at Sept 18th. Public website that will have a lot of information.

VIII. Priorities and Projects of the Academic Senate – Senator Tracy Nothnagel

- a. Last meeting asked what priorities of the Academic Senate should be. Saw 6 major themes. Sent a survey to prioritize those 6 major themes. Breaking into small groups to discuss: food on campus, enrollment, quality and consistency of courses, student perspective.
 - i. Senator Denise Warner Budget Committee identified this is a project. Ask admin about the barriers to getting food back on campus. Want to survey students. Grab and go is more profitable than hot food. Having problems bringing vendors in because don't see enough foot traffic for income. Chicken and egg problem. Don't have a reason to linger because don't have options to stay for food. Also look at the healthiness of food choices in the grab and go.

- ii. Senator Tim Deines Enrollment is a more complex issue than realized. Positive things coming out of Marketing. Helpful if Senate had a holistic conversation that connected the dots on understanding recruitment, marketing, and continuing students and retention. What can programs do to help retention? Flexibilities of offerings and modalities. What can Senate help to do with retention?
- iii. Director of Advising Chelsea Brandon Student perspective: drilled down to institutionalizing getting student advice or input. Through surveys but don't want survey burnout. Idea of drop in forums but that is tricky due to limited foot traffic. Utilizing students when implementing new projects or software. Incentivize student help with food, swag, etc. student outreach, involve students with projects on campus. More students on SAC, paying students for their time.
- iv. Senator Tammy McDiarmid Quality and consistency of courses. Needs to be consistency across the college with different things. Consistency with modalities. Consistency between 16-, 14- and 8-week courses.
 Getting students into the right course. Consistent expectations for online classes from instructor for asynchronous online class.
- v. Will be continuing to talk about this. Will be asking Senators to step up and lead the charge.

 - a. Tricia McKay brought this to academic affairs over summer. Push on federal and state level governments for institutions to recognize licensures to award credit. Have a process already. <u>Licensure and Certification webpage</u>
 - b. MCCA is asking that each college identify each course and not just program credit. This is so students can see what license will give them which course. Not asking programs to award credit they don't already give, just identify which courses they aware direct credit and post on the website.
 - c. we are using "Licensure", "Certification", and "Credential" all interchangeably here.
 - d. Adding a note onto areas pathways is also helpful.
