“Cocurricular Definition and Inclusion Criteria

LCC defines cocurricular as *Cocurricular refers to activities and events that enhance and complement the educational experience at LCC, relate to the essential learning outcomes, and connect students to the college and community. “*

Identifying Cocurricular programs

- Also from the [Cocurricular Student Learning Assessment Handbook](#)

“Inclusion criteria to meet the cocurricular definition include the following:

- ✓ *Must be aligned to one or more institutional-level learning outcomes, Essential Learning Outcomes (ELOs)*
- ✓ *May be on or off campus*
- ✓ *Learning experience is not mandatory to student*
- ✓ *May not be explicitly tied to a program of study or course*
- ✓ *Augments the college learning experience*
- ✓ *Is capable of eliciting and providing direct evidence of student learning “*

- Questions arise quickly such as, “Is Starscapes considered curricular or cocurricular?”

Criteria item changes

- Reword From: “Learning experience is not mandatory to student”
 - To: “The cocurricular experience is not mandatory to student”
- Remove: “May be on or off campus” from the list

Discussion of details that make a cocurricular activity

- Services verses learning, must be intentional learning.
 - Example ODI services of an informational or social gathering is different than an intentional learning being facilitated in that session.
 - Example a facilitated financial workshop could have an intentional learning end
 - Many items will not be included in assessment, they will be evaluated at some point but not assessed
 - CASL is only interested in assessing the learning portion of activities withing programs that have been defined as cocurricular. Not all of the activities a program offers will meet that criterion but will assess the ones that do.
- Extracurricular activities will still exist, an activity does not have to be cocurricular.
- Who is accountable for the assessment?
 - We tell HLC what our programs are and how we assess them.
 - We hand them our process with examples.
 - If we are still wrangling with how this irons out that is okay
- Intent of this work is to show HLC we are progressing from the original quality initiative statement.
- Important to remember some activities are not attached to a course.

- Non course based cocurricular work also needs to be assessed
- D2L can be the assessment home for that as well
- When any cocurricular points to an ELO there is a global aspect to it.
 - The information is shared among all participants, for example One Book

Reviewing existing cocurricular list in the handbook

- Keep the following from the original list
 - ODI Student Programming (ACCESS, MAP)
 - Leadership academy
 - Cardio exercise and student success
 - Library
- Who might be added?
 - Writing center
 - Starscapes
 - Committee run, Jeff Janowick, Danielle Savory, Joe Esquibel, Melinda Wilson, Melissa Kaplan, and Suzanne Bernsten
 - Beyond the Book – One Book Committee
 - Has a committee running it as well, not sure if under ODI or transitioning elsewhere
 - Athletics

Next Steps

- Bring leadership from those areas identified above into CASL conversations so all on same page in terms of scope and timelines.
 - Great idea because this needs to be a college-wide initiative that's tied to accreditation so should involve CASL leadership
- How do we onboard them?
 - In the past following steps:
 - Program planning
 - Define a Learning Pillar
 - Work on how to make that learning pillar happen
 - Initial cocurricular group, from review report, was part of decision making with a CASL subcommittee, that might be a good way to continue with new people
- What groundwork is needed before inviting people into the conversation?
 - Want to have some assessment data by August, there is some urgency.
 - Would like to see some of cocurricular leadership participate in a January CASL meeting

Subcommittee or all of CASL meet with leadership

- How do we prepare to meet with cocurricular leadership?
- Deadlines:
 - Data is needed to be collected by end of semester
 - New cocurricular as well as previously identified cocurricular data is needed
 - Assurance argument needs to be completed in May
 - Final compiled documentation submitted to HLC in August
- Would like cocurricular people to meet with all of CASL before a subcommittee is formed.
- Heidi proposes, she, Tim, Karen, and Mark meet to discuss goals before cocurricular folks are met.
- This is significant, so onboarding cocurricular leadership into the whole CASL group makes sense.

- This is something that should ideally have happened before now (4-6 years ago).
- LCC is good because we are doing this but it has to happen now
