Given the rise of generative AI, this course is particularly relevant in helping students understand the value of using writing in one's own language and voice as a tool for inquiry, critical thinking, and self-knowledge. It also enhances our equity initiative by exposing students to a diverse body of cutting-edge contemporary literature and valuing individual language use and expression.
