CITS 225 Change Prerequisite Courses: Minimum 2.0 in CITF 120 or CITS 125 CITS 125, a 6-credit course, covers a very broad range of topics, and while integral to supportfocused pathways (e.g., extensive Windows coverage, etc.), some of these topics are less helpful for other areas of focus. CITF 120 provides sufficient coverage of the core concepts required for preparation in terms of succeeding in CITS 225, and this 3-credit course provides a bit more flexibility in 	

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		terms of LCC pathways (e.g., cloud, etc.) and transfer opportunities that meet the prerequisite requirements.
